9	Urban Forestry – Work has begun on forming a Manitoba Urban Forest Council. Goal is to improve urban forestry in the province, develop best practices, network, and share ideas. Kyla stressed the importance of an urban forest tree inventory for the successful management of invasive species and general evidence-based decision making; province is developing a database for communities to use for this as Brandon continues its tree inventory. Idea of having a mill to process local diseased trees (Elm, Ash in future) at the new Makerspace workshop was explored – stringent regulatory protocols will have to be followed. Canadian Urban Forestry Conference to be held in Winnipeg in 2022 – organized by Kyla and colleagues.	Kyla	5 minutes
10	Ideas for 2019 – Look into new Chairperson for 2019 BEC meetings. Roy asserted the importance of rounded curbs over square curbs on the environmental impact of concrete production and street accidents, streets and roads maintenance and engineering practices, and accessibility and transit planning. Look into drafting proposal for a small-scale rounded curb project to bring to City staff. Explore uses for small amount of methane captured at the landfill such as heating a boiler for the Material Recovery Facility. Explore use of wood chips as fuel source for boiler or as another energy source. Enviro Expo will go ahead for 2019.	All	20 minutes
